



Walk by Faith

Second Corinthians 5:7

“For we walk by faith, not by sight.”

“We must develop a daily, consistent trust in those things we must believe but cannot see.”

Icebreaker (Optional – 5 minutes)

Share about a time when what you first saw turned out not to tell the whole story. What changed your understanding?

1. Look Beyond What Is Visible

Understanding the limitations of sight. Paul reminds us in 2 Corinthians 4:18 that what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal. Sight is immediate and persuasive, but it does not tell the whole story.

In Second Kings 6, Elisha’s servant saw an army. Elisha saw the Lord’s protection.

Discussion Question 1

Where in your life right now are you tempted to interpret reality only by what you can see?

2. Feed Your Mind with the Word of God

Understanding the source of faith Romans 10:17 teaches that faith comes by hearing the Word of God. Faith grows when we listen to what God has said.

The Word of God: Anchors faith in promises Corrects distorted vision, rehearses God's faithfulness and reframes temporary suffering in eternal light

Every major act of faith in Scripture is tied to a word from God. Faith is not guessing — it is responding.

Discussion Question 2

What practical habits help you “hear” God’s Word consistently? Where do you struggle most with consistency?

3 . Practice Trust in Daily Decisions

Understanding the necessity of practice. Walking implies movement and repetition. Faith grows through use — not theory. Faith is practiced: At decision time, During uncertainty, In ordinary routines, After failure

Discussion Question 4

What is one current decision or situation where God may be asking you to walk by faith instead of sight?

5. Receive Grace After Failure

Walking by faith includes trusting God’s grace when we fall short.
