Worship Him as the only Savior

Amen

The term "amen" is derived from "firm,"

"fixed," or "sure," and the related Hebrew verb
also means "to be reliable" and "to be trusted."

The Greek Old Testament usually translates
amen as "so be it"; in the English Bible it has
frequently been rendered as "verily," or

"truly."

It can be perhaps best thought of as an agreement that something is true or we wish for it to be true in our world and experience

Jude gave seven commands to believers:

- 1. Earnestly contend for the faith (v. 3).
- 2. Remember the teaching and warning of the apostles (v. 17).
- 3. Build yourselves up in the most holy faith (v. 20).
- 4. Pray in the Holy Spirit (v. 20).
- 5. Keep yourselves in the love of God (v. 21).
- 6. Look for the mercy of the Lord to bring you to eternal life (v. 21).
- 7. Show mercy to Christians who are doubting, snatch unbelievers from the fire, and cautiously show mercy to the corrupt (vv. 22–23).
